

# PONY AND AMMUNITION

- ❑ Infantry units armed with shooting weapons may carry extra ammunition.
- ❑ This ammunition is carried by pack-horse/pony or other appropriate animal.
- ❑ A maximum of five pack-animals per unit may be obtained.
- ❑ Each animal may carry up to 2 volley counter's worth of ammunition. Each such volley counter costs 35 points. These volleys may be given to the unit to replace expended ammunition from their allocation of six or used instead of one of those six. The unit may never have more than six volleys carried by the soldiers.
- ❑ Each pack-animal requires a soldier be detached from the unit to look after it. Those soldiers cannot take part in shooting until the volleys they are keeping have been spent and the animal released. If they take part in shooting or are compelled to fight or are killed, the pack-animal escapes taking any remaining volleys with them.
- ❑ Volley counters still may not be exchanged between units.
- ❑ Pack animals do not have to remain with their unit, but their volleys may only be used (or transferred to the soldiers) while they are in base-to-base contact with the unit.
